### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

About 8 years ago Nicholas Pauling (Elliot) and I were sitting in tiger mascot outfits in the refuse corridor of a major shopping mall having a smoke break. Having just finished drama school we had found work dressing up as tiger mascots walking around the mall entertaining children shopping with their families. We realized quite early on that getting hit on the head, pushed around and assaulted in the suits went hand in hand with doing the job. It was during this smoke break where Nicholas turned to me and said "4 years of drama school man, what the hell are we doing here"? To which I replied "I don't know but this would make a great play" - And so the idea for **Champ** was conceived on the floor of a refuse area of a major shopping mall in a mixture of our sweat, tears and cigarette smoke.

Nicholas and I took our idea to Louis Viljoen and he developed and evolved it into a perfect set of jaded characters, who will both horrify and charm with their machine gun dialogue and chaotic perceptions of the small locker room they inhabit every day.

Directing *Champ* has been a long time goal for me, it is the product of years of working and developing the idea with Louis Viljoen. The process has been exhilarating, terrifying and sometimes maddening but it has never stopped making me laugh.
