ERIC ABRAHAM - PRODUCER



ric Abraham is a film, television and theatre producer, best known for producing the Academy Award-winning film *Kolya* (Best Foreign Language Film, 1996). A South Africanborn former foreign correspondent and antiapartheid activist, banned and house-arrested in 1976 and exiled for sixteen years, he became a producer of BBC TV's *Panorama* before going on to form his own production company, Portobello.

He produced many acclaimed television dramas including John le Carre's A Murder Of Quality and the BBC TV crime series Dalziel & Pascoe. He produced a number of films including Roald Dahl's Danny The Champion Of The World, Jan Sveråk's Dark Blue World, Empties and Kooky, Tim Roth's The War Zone, Jez Butterworth's Mojo and Birthday Girl, Jiri Menzel's The Life And Extraordinary Adventures Of Private Ivan Chonkin and Quiet Chaos starring Nanni Moretti.

With his wife, publisher and philanthropist Sigrid Rausing, Eric Abraham co-founded Portobello Books in 2005, and later that year they acquired the highly regarded literary journal Granta and Granta Books.

As a theatre producer, his credits include Hugh Whitemore's adaptation of Pirandello's As You Desire Me, starring Bob Hoskins and Kristin Scott-Thomas; Christopher Hampton's stage version of Sandor Marai's Embers directed by Michael Blakemore, which marked Jeremy Irons' return to the stage after twenty years; and Polly Stenham's multi-award winning That Face. He has commissioned new plays from, amongst others, Nicholas Wright, Hugh Whitemore, Frank McGuinness and Rebecca Lenkiewicz.

In 2006 he set up Isango Portobello, a new collaboration with award-winning director Mark Dornford-May. Their first productions together were *A Christmas Carol – Ikrismas Kherol* and *The Magic Flute – Impempe Yomlingo*. They premiered in Cape Town and in London to major acclaim.

Eric Abraham is a member of the Academy of Motion Pictures Arts and Sciences (AMPAS), the British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA), and the European and Czech Film Academies.

THE STORY SO FAR



ver thirty five years ago, as a Cape Townborn foreign correspondent, I helped give voices within the disenfranchised black majority an opportunity to be heard abroad. Now, as a film and theatre producer, I would like to do the same for some of this country's extraordinary creative talent.

Isango Portobello and The Fugard Theatre had their genesis in Cape Town in early 2006 when actress Janet Suzman arranged for me to have dinner with the British, but South African-based, director Mark Dornford-May.

The notion of a Cape Town-based company of black South African actors, a kind of embryonic Black South African National Theatre, was floated. Since I have always believed in the power of theatre to transform people's lives and provide narratives of inspiration and awareness I agreed to underwrite the development of a new company, Isango Portobello, and produce its productions in South Africa and abroad.

We decided to workshop a few universal classics so that we could perform two in repertory. Mozart's *The Magic Flute* and Charles Dickens' *A Christmas Carol* were decided on and the productions were rapturously received at Cape Town's Baxter Theatre and London's Young Vic.

In February 2008 The Magic Flute – Impempe Yomlingo transferred to the Duke of York's theatre for an acclaimed West End season and won the Olivier Award for Best Musical Revival (2008). The Company then embarked on a world tour of the production which included performances in Dublin, Japan, Singapore, the Netherlands and France, where it played at the iconic Chatelet theatre.

The trajectory of the Company has been extraordinary and inspiring. From Khayelitsha to the world! *The Magic Flute* also played to packed houses at the Market Theatre in Johannesburg, where we made the entire run free to acknowledge the fact that most South Africans are extremely poor.

Last year, Minister Trevor Manuel accepted our invitation to be the Company's Patron and we returned to London's West End with The Mysteries – Yiimimangaliso, again achieving considerable critical acclaim.

I felt that the time had come for the Company to have a permanent rehearsal and performance space in Cape Town. District Six's Sacks Futeran Building seemed the perfect venue within which to create a purpose-built theatre and rehearsal room. I decided to underwrite the undertaking myself. There was never any doubt in my mind as to what we should call it. South African drama has only one 'man of magnitude' – Athol Fugard. He not only consented but also wrote a new and intensely powerful play, *The Train Driver*, which he directed for our opening season.

Work on The Fugard began in August 2009 and the theatre was handed over six months later. We are now delighted to present *Aesop's Fables*, the first worldwide premiere that Isango Portobello have performed at The Fugard Theatre.

The future success of the Company and this Theatre depends on the people of Cape Town and South Africa opening their minds, hearts and pockets. Let's hope they will have a long and exciting history.

esop's Fables have survived and been passed down from generation to generation for over two thousand years. They survive because of their humanity and intrinsic morality.

What is remarkable is that Aesop was not free born but a slave, and yet he managed to remain open and aware of the world around him. In the tales the animal kingdom mirrors the human world both in its absurdity and complexity.

PETER TERSON Author

Peter Terson is a British playwright, born in Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Since the 1960s, Peter has written more than 50 stage plays and over 15 radio and television plays. He was writer-in-residence at The Victoria Theatre, Stoke-on-Trent, from 1966 where many of his stage plays, including Aesop's Fables, premiered. He has written a number of plays for the National Youth Theatre, including Zigger Zagger, The Apprentices and Fuzz. His 1984 production, Strippers, successfully transferred to London's West End.

Other plays include The Night John; But Fred, Freud is Dead; Good Lads at Heart; Mooney and his Caravans; The Mighty Reservoir and A Night to Make the Angels Weep.

Peter has been awarded John Whiting and the Writers Guild of Great Britain Awards.

Mark has worked in South Africa since 2000 and was co-founder of Isango Portobello in 2006.
